

October 25th 1928

The regular Monthly Meeting of the Pastoral Committee was held October 25th 1928. 21 members were present.

The meeting was opened with a season of prayer, after which the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Lewis C. Mooney reported that lists of members had been prepared and given out, hoping that the membership would all be visited by October 31st.

He also reported that the reception to students had taken place, 75 were present, an interesting program had been arranged, the ministers of nine churches participating. Dr. Schraff of Johns Hopkins University making the address.

A. Morris Carey, Mary P. Applegarth and Thomas J. Clark were appointed to have charge of the Thursday evening meetings.

The Representatives to the Quarterly Meeting reported that all attended. The meeting was unusually interesting, the thought most prominent was the encouraging of young people to engage in the work of the Church.

The Clerk opened the subject of revising the list of members on earnest discussion followed, the feeling was expressed that the time had come for the Monthly Meeting to consider the filling of vacancies caused by the removal from the City of several of the members.

As according to Discipline the Committee to consider the subject would have to be appointed by the Monthly Meeting no action was taken by this meeting but the work was expressed that the Monthly Meeting be asked to take action in regard to the subject.

A Report to the Monthly Meeting was presented and adopted and directed to be forwarded to that meeting.
