Pastoral care has been given to the members of the meeting, and there has been correspondence with the non-resident members.

New life has come into the Light Street meeting, and definite arrangements have been made with James Thomas Chappell to work in that meeting. His labors, combined with the renewed interest and effort on the part of others have borne fruit, so that the Local Business Meeting has been revived to give opportunity for the development of the members. A series of meetings held by George C. Wise at Light Street had considerable effect upon many of the younger people.

The offer of the use of the Homewood building to the Hopkins University Young Men's Christian Association has been freely accepted and we have the pleasure of knowing that its facilities have been of great service to the young men, especially to those from foreign countries for whom it has been quite a headquarters.
