A Meeting of Ministry & Oversight and the Pastoral Committee was held December 17th 1925 with fourteen members present.

After a period of devotion the Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A Report was made of the joint Mtg. held with the Park Avenue Friends on Thanksgiving Day. The attendance was satisfactory and the meeting a profitable occasion.

The Committee on the Visitation Evangelism Movement reported that they were arranging plans to cooperate with the Eastern District Churches from February 21st to 28th.

The Committee on Visiting Ministers reported that the Meeting had been attended recently by Alfred H. Layton of London. Leach Meeting, Bruce Curry in connection with a Students Bible Conference, Murray Kenworthy by arrangement of the Leach Meeting Committee on Missions. Thomas L. Harrison of the Fellowship of Young Men Peace, Levi S. Pennington, President of Pacific College S. J. Jamney Hallow from Gilman County School and Frederick J. Libby of the Council for Presentation of War.
