TO THE MONTHLY MEETING.

In accordance with ~~the~~ our former report, (to the December Monthly Meeting,) the Committee in reference to Light St. has continued to give much attention to the service, some of them having attended nearly all the Light St meetings during the past winter. In that time the average attendance has doubled and there seems to be a corresponding increase in the religious life, so that we are confirmed in the judgment expressed in our last report that the more distinctively Friendly type of meeting is best suited to their present need.

We have just had a conference with their concerned members who seem to be united in the above decision. We therefore recommend that the present arrangement with our Friend Thomas J. Chappell, which terminates at the end of June, be not renewed, but that the Meeting be placed for the present under the care of a Committee of Baltimore Monthly Meeting consisting of Friends of both Homewood and Light St Meetings.

In thus closing the connection which has existed during the past three years, we wish to express our appreciation of the christian character of our Friend Thomas Chappell and our sense of his faithfulness in his service. We trust that nothing will interfere with the cordial relations which we have hitherto enjoyed with him and his family.
