3. A letter from Mary & Cary asks to release her from the position of recording clerk. With many expressions of regret and appreciation for her service the meeting accepts her resignation. Richard J. White and Lewis Moon are appointed to nominate to next meeting a person to serve in that capacity.
4. This Committee approves the payment of our part of the joint church budget given to Hopkins Students.
5. A letter to be sent to our resident membership from this Committee was read at this time. This meeting approves sending this letter, and instructs the Meeting Secretary to prepare and mail it out. A copy hereunto attached.
6. The matter of visiting our members was brought to the attention of the Committee. Our Committee on

visiting is instructed to take up this matter and report to next meeting.

7. After discussion it was decided to send a letter to our non-resident members. This was referred to our overseers.
8. The Anniversary day Meeting at which Sherwood Eddy will speak was called to our attention, and the secretary is urged to do everything possible to let the public know about the meeting.
9. The Meeting Secretary brought to mind the leaflets which were printed for the meeting some time ago for the purpose of advertising the meeting in the neighborhood. He is instructed to place these leaflets in the apartment houses and homes nearby.
