his dogs on them, But it so
turned out that the dogs seized
one of his own calves, which
heightned his Rage of Anger
very much, & Running at
that time, to Relieve the calf
fell down out of Breath, so
that he never Revived more
he held Many Black People in
Slavery —

2nd mo 19th 1791 Surry Count^y
North Carolina
Simone Hadlee ^{of this place} Informs
me of the three following Persons
being drowned, at different times, through
Intoxication with strong Drink, at
the same place, crossing the ~~Allen~~
yadkin River, at the yellow Bank
forde, viz James Glen, a member of
the General Assembly of this State
& a hard Drinker, about this time
four years ago, he having caught
some fresh fish in the River, drank
two much ~~it~~ in the morning, then
set off with a Mass of the fish, to
a Tavern keeper living at the
County Court House, & there drank
till he was quite Drunk, then
towards evening, set off to Ride
home, & fell off in the River &
was Drowned, at the yellow-
Bank forde — Since then
