

At a regular Monthly Meeting of Friends Federal Hill Gospel Mission held Jan. 4th 1881, (the first one held in the new Mission House), present 18 members and 5 Associate Members.

The Finance Committee reported that \$3.65 had been received from the box, and \$1.- paid out in aid of a sick member. The total in the Treasury is \$27.41, of which \$23.26 is in the Central Savings Bank.

The Committee on Oversight reported that the first meetings in the new House were held on Sunday the 12th December, and were followed by a series of four meetings during that week, all of which were profitable & satisfactory.

The Committee on Membership recommended that Geo. W. Lambdin & Jesse Hill be received as Associate Members, which, being separately considered, were united with, and the Committee were directed to notify them of their reception.

The Visiting Committee reported some work done.

The Committee appointed to organize a Bible School on Sunday mornings reported that the school was opened on the 2nd Jan. with 17 scholars, & promises of several others. The Committee was continued.

John R. Cary, John Marshall & Priscilla Harper were appointed to propose to our next meeting the name of a Friend to act as Clerk of this Meeting for the ensuing year.

John Marshall was released from the Oversight Committee at his own request, and the Committee to propose a Clerk were also directed to name a Friend to fill the vacancy in the Oversight Committee.

The report of the attendance the past month was read, showing an average of 32½ on Sunday morning, 116 Sunday night (including the opening meeting of 300) and 26 on Friday night.
