

At a regular Monthly Meeting of Friends Federal Hill Mission held Feb. 1st 1881. present 11 Members & 4 Associates.

The Committee on the Sabbath School reported that it was growing in numbers and interest, & that 42 children were in attendance last Sabbath.

The Committee appointed to propose the name of a Friend to serve as Clerk to this Meeting for this year proposed John C. Thomas, which was acceptable to the Meeting, and he was appointed to that service.

The same Committee proposed Edward L. Palmer to fill the vacancy in the Oversight Committee, which was acceptable to the meeting, and he was accordingly appointed.

The Finance Committee reported that \$2.⁶³ had been received from the box, and none expended, making the total in the Treasury \$30.⁰⁴, of which \$27.²⁶ is in the Central Savings Bank.

At the recommendation of the Oversight Committee, the two following Queries were adopted and directed to be read alternately, one each monthly meeting, and seriously considered.

- 1st. Do you maintain love towards each other becoming our Christian profession? Do you discourage tale-bearing and detraction? And do you endeavor to put an end to differences when they arise?
- 2nd. Do you endeavor, by example & precept, to bring up your children and those under your care, in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and in that plainness and simplicity of life which the Gospel enjoins? Do you guard them against reading pernicious books, and from the corrupt conversation of the world? And are they encouraged frequently to read the Holy Scriptures?
