 Brooks of the Mothers Meeting begun in
 1867; John C. Thomas described the ^{beginning} organ-
 ization of this Mission Meeting in 1875.
 John R. Carey told of the opening of the
 First-day school in 1881, & then of the
 Savings Fund for our members & others, which
 has since developed into the Provident
 Savings Bank. Other departments of
 mission work carried on in this building
 were also referred to.

The committee on Cottage Prayer Meeting
 reported 3 meetings held with an average
 attendance of 9 persons.

4 Tuesday night prayer meetings have
 been held the past month, with an
 average attendance of 15, & very satis-
 factory meetings. Five Young People's
