

were threatened with his vengeance. & his judgments prayed for on their devoted heads, & that they might be removed out of the way. The people were advised not to listen to their counsels, or to be influenced by them in any way hereafter, whatever their station & standing in the Church might be, but having come out on the broad platform of liberty, to be untrammelled by either man, nor woman henceforth. This language was used not once, or twice, only, by those people, but every time I attended those meetings there was more, or less, of invective & exposure of Friends here, & elsewhere. Intermixed with wonderful revelations concerning herself - and the number of conversions she had made. Told the people she was wanted in Cincinnati, Wilmington, Richmond, and other places. That they had not been invited to Waynesville, but the Lord sent them here. It made no difference who were opposed to it, they intended to stay here if it should be three years, until He showed them it was time to leave. Said they had the sanction of the Yearly Mgs. Committee, & backed by Indiana Y. Meeting. & that Charles & Roda Coffin were praying for them. About half the members appeared ready to unite with -

them in their manner of worship. Some of the people professed conversion, others to have been warmed up - but many have asked what was meant by so much fault finding of the Church members in public. Some of our best members, left those meetings, & have not returned.

They told the audience one first day, when a number of Strangers were present, that there were Church members present who would have them put out the door if they could, but they cared for no opposition, for they were doing the Lord's work, & those who opposed them were envious of their success. Alas! there was nothing to envy - much to agonize over.

They staid nearly four weeks, when they left, saying they intended returning in a short time. The dissension & sorrow which they left ^{behind them} where harmony and brotherly love had predominated, is incalculable. -
