

jury to decide, a basis of the testimony of witnesses summoned before it, whether or not there are sufficient grounds for indicting anyone in connection with the Williams lynching—either as leader of the mob or as a member of it.

The Wicomico County Circuit Court is in session, and if any indictments are returned, it is likely the trial may be held immediately.
