TO THE EDITOR OF THE SUN—Sir: I have read with great interest Senator William Cabell Bruce's letter to you, published in *The Sun* of yesterday, with reference to Dr. Broadus Mitchell and other critics of the people of the Eastern Shore of Maryland.
