The Attorney-General in a letter he sent to the proper authorities on the Eastern Shore Orphan Jones case stating that "this case ought not be tried in Dorchester county and should be removed for trial to some court of this State sitting in a community free from the influences that have manifested themselves in Worcester and Dorchester counties."

Mr. Lane's statement was followed by reports of a projected meeting here of the three judges of the First Judicial Circuit to consider the impending trial in Cambridge of Yuel Lee, alias Orphan Jones, in the light of last night's events here. Lee is charged with the murder of a family of four in Worcester county.

The judges, John R. Pattison, Joseph L. Bailey and Robert F. Duer, ruled last week in Snow Hill that there was not a sufficient threat of mob violence to prejudice Lee's chances for a fair trial on the Eastern Shore. None of the judges was willing to confirm the reports that the conference was scheduled, but some of them said it was "extremely likely."
